

Traditional Table Setting Guide



You don't have to use a traditional table place setting for entertaining. You can create a thoughtful tablescape that works for the occasion and what you have on hand. Here are some tips for setting a table for different types of Holiday gatherings:

Casual

A casual table setting is simple and practical, and can include a placemat, dinner plate, cutlery, water glass, and napkin. You can use disposable plates, cups, and cutlery. For a pop of color, you can add a table runner or use napkins in fun colors or folds.

Family-style

For family-style meals, you can leave the plates on the table so guests can serve themselves.

Traditional

You can use fine china, elegant table decorations, and traditional table setting rules. You can also mix and match china sets, or add colorful glassware.

Large group

If you're expecting a large group, you can spread them out across multiple tables so each guest has at least two feet of space. Just be sure that you pay each table the same amount of attention regarding decor.



A creative tablecloth can set the stage for your Holiday theme.

- Lay an old quilt with holiday colors or patterns over the table for a cozy, nostalgic feel. This works beautifully for a rustic or cottage-style holiday theme.
- Repurpose a large plaid blanket or scarf as a tablecloth. Plaid patterns instantly evoke holiday cheer and add warmth to your table.
- Layer a lace curtain or lace fabric over a colored tablecloth (red, green, or gold) for a delicate and elegant holiday vibe.
- Cover the table with brown kraft paper and use calligraphy or festive markers to draw place settings, menus, or whimsical holiday doodles directly on the paper.
- Use natural canvas, painter's drop cloth or burlap tablecloth for a rustic, minimal, or Scandinavian look.
- Bed sheets will have the perfect color or pattern you want to include in your Holiday look at a fraction of the cost of a tablecloth. XL Twin sheets tend to work best on a rectangular table.

10 Important Things to Remember when Setting Up a Children's Table

4. Provide Personalized Seating
